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Dear Dr. Kober,

Thank you very much for your last letter. Here I am taking up your time again, but it's not anything requiring an answer - just a little paper which may be of use or interest - though I've no doubt that you have already the makings of a pretty good "A" index yourself.

Of course the "transcript" has its limitations, but it justifies itself, to me, by the fact that without it I just wouldn't know where to start in getting out an analysis of this kind. I'm very interested in your idea of classifying the signs according to 'use' :- one difficulty is that I had to get out some sort of order as a basis for doing the list and analysis, and Myres' seemed the most handy foundation. I have tried to break the function of the signs down to some extent in the notes to the table of signs on the back cover. But just how do you mean use:-

- 1) Whether the signs are 'syllabic' or 'ideographic' or both?
- 2) Whether they are frequent or infrequent?
- 3) Whether they are initial or final?

I'm with you on the first point, but it seems to me that to arrange the "A" signs in a particular order ~~in~~ according to (2) and (3) may land you in difficulties where the "B" equivalents are found to have divergent frequencies and positions.

Having gone through Carratelli fairly carefully, I feel fairly happy that the "A" signary is there in reasonable order, but admittedly the B list probably still contains some unnecessary details. If you ever have a spare moment, I'd be glad to have a note on what you would advise striking out or adding in, so that we can make the transcript more efficient.
