Dear Mrs. Adkins:

Your airmail letter of November 18 just arrived yesterday. It looks like you are full of energy and pep, I am glad to note. Just don't try to do too much, please.

The specimens which Si sent to Spath were, as far as I can ascertain without going to the Bureau, several of the type specimens of Scaphites subevolutus Böse figured in University of Texas Bull. 2748, pl. 18, fig. 8, and refigured in University of Texas Bull. 2838, pl. 23, fig. 10. They are well illustrated in both bulletins, so it should be possible to recognize them provided they are there.

If I were in Austin at the Bureau, I could help you more; for there I left a complete card file of Si's type specimens showing which were missing and which had been located.

You probably have received my previous letter giving a long list of fossils that are desirable.

I hope the weather is better in England than here.
