My dear Mr. Harrington:

I am glad to know that you are in Houston County and that the work has started.

With regard to instruments, the Bureau can let you have for use during this work a rock hammer and, if you wish, a level, and perhaps also a Brunton. With regard to maps, there is no post route map of Houston County. I will, however, see if we can find for you either a soil map or a topographic map for part of the County. If available, these will come to you in a few days.

Dr. Stensel will probably have occasion to come to that part of the State in the near future and will see you. Work in Leon County will begin on Saturday, December 5th. Mr. Davis Crow is in charge of the Leon County work. He is to report to Palestine on Saturday, and if you have an opportunity, it might be well to talk with him since you are working in adjoining counties.
