Dear Stenzel:

I have a sixteen page discussion of the vertebrates of Burkville written for the A.A.P.G.. The concluding paragraph is on the relationships, the distribution, and the age of the Burkville vertebrates. It needs a correction here and there and retyping. I will send it to you toward the end of the week. The paper you spoke of that I sent to Blau is a preliminary discussion of all the Gulf Coast vertebrate faunas. The complete paper on the Burkville vertebrates includes descriptions and figures. It is about done, and I believe I will send it to the American Journal of Science as Hull suggests.

We must decide what to do with the turtle egg manuscript which he still has. Should both of these papers be published, there would be considerable duplication in text. Let me know what you think.
