Dear Mr. Homan:

The second package of fossils arrived safely and contained material that is very useful to me. I appreciate greatly your generosity in offering me these fossils without asking for remuneration. However, I believe you can use remuneration very well for the purpose of financing more collecting trips, if not for other purposes. For this reason there is a check for \$15.30 enclosed.

I would like to see all your rudistids. If they are not useful, they will be sent back to you. However, some of them may turn out to be useful; one can never know. Also please collect more specimens of the red Gryphaea mucronata from the same near McGregor. They are needed for thin sections. Also, some more of the Gryphaea that were found together with the Exogyra texana near White Mound, Coryell County.

Two-mile Creek in Leon County is about six miles southeast of Leona, in the southeastern part of the county. On its banks is Two-Mile Church (colored). The fossils are above and below the county road bridge at Two-Mile Church. The best way to get there is to drive to Leona and to ask for Two-Mile Church. Unfortunately I don't have a spare map of Leon County to give you. Good luck.
