Dear Mr. Matthews:

I have now had an opportunity to discuss with my associates your request for funds necessary to enable you to carry on summer field work and to travel from Austin to Washington.

I am glad to let you know that we have approved your request. Accordingly, I am asking our Comptroller to send you as soon as possible a check in the amount of \$356. This amount represents a flat allowance of \$181, for which no accounting will be required, toward the expenses of your trip from Austin to Washington and return. The check also includes an allowance of \$175 toward the expenses of your field work at Port Aransas. We would like you to submit a statement of your expenditures under this second allowance. The statement should have your adviser's approval. I hope your summer's work will prove to be both pleasant and productive.
