My dear Dr. Stenzel:

This will acknowledge your letter of January 16. I note that you wish to be relieved from your work in the Bureau at the end of the present month and also that you would like leave of absence. I am recommending both.

The principal advantage of the leave of absence, as I understand it, is to retain University connection until the salary schedule of the next biennium shall have been determined. Assuming that this information will be available by June at the latest, I am recommending that you be given leave of absence from February 1 to June 30, 1937. If you should not return to the Bureau this will allow us sometime in which to find a successor before the beginning of the next fiscal year.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my personal regret if you should leave the Bureau permanently and to say that your two and a half-years service in the Bureau have been in all respects satisfactory and most agreeable to those of us who have been your associates in this work.
