Dear Dr.Stenzel,

I am at last returning to you the Cirripedes that you were so kind as to send me on loan, and you will see from the labels that I intend eventually to figure four of the specimens. My Catalogue, however, will take a long time yet to complete, since it deals with all the known forms.

I am sending you, as a present, some valves of three species related to your Claiborne species, and two of the sets are valuable in so far that they include all the known valves, and will help in case the missing valves of your Claiborne forms turn up.

Since I am figuring the best valves of your specimens of Euscalpellum eocenense, I wonder whether you could spare a rostrum (label D) and scutum (label B), for that would still leave you one each of these valves in addition to the figured specimens.
