Dear Keith:

Time is approaching when I have to start disposing of my personal library. I happen to have several old field note books which by their nature should go to Texas. Therefore, I am offering them first to the University of Texas.

They are: (1) "Geological Field Notes of Alexander Deussen. Date: August 1910 to 5/27/13." The notes are on loose-leaf sheets 3 3/4 by 6 3/4 inches in size. The bundle is about 1 inch thick. I believe these notes pertain mostly to the Professional Paper 126, which was published in 1924. On p. 446 is a hand-colored "Sketch Map showing Geology of Barton Creek near Austin, Texas" Scale 1/2" = 1 mile with numerous accompanying notes. Dated 3/21/13.

(2) to (7) Six field note books, 4 1/2 by 7 1/2 inches in size, written by William Kennedy. Most of them are the old Texas Geological Survey note books and date from about July 1891. One book is titled "Gas and Petroleum Notes" and "Tertiary Fossils."

Altogether there are 7 note books.

I am offering these seven items for \$1000.00.

It was nice to talk to you in Mexico City, and I hope you survived the trip in good shape.
