Many thanks for your letter of March 8, asking for advice regarding the possibility of your shifting your main field of activity to numismatics. I have the greatest respect for the Am Numismatic Society, and a position there seems to me fully as worthy as one in a University, and it offers more opportunity for publication. If you are really interested in Roman coins I think you stand very well in the subject, and the possibilities for original work are manifold.

It is of course a serious business to make so great a change in your activities at this time; I take it you have talked it over fully with Marja. You will yourself have to take the responsibility for the decision.

openings at Michigan & Okla-  
homa, and I had hoped some-

in the way of opportunity. But  
if you take it, I think you will  
have to go into Roman coins  
wholeheartedly and with complete  
concentration. I'm writing this in

you before you go to NY on the 26<sup>th</sup>
