**Lynn Baker** gave a paper on "The Role of States' Rights in Protecting the Rights of Minorities: Lessons from the U.S. Experience" at a conference on "Comparative Constitutional Law: Defining the Field," held at Georgetown University Law Center on Sept. 17, 1999. At the American Political Science Association annual meeting in Atlanta, Sept. 4, 1999, **Baker** presented a paper entitled "Toward a Federalism for the 21st Century: The Case for Non-Parametric Judicial Review under the Spending Clause."

**Philip Bobbitt's** remarks in a panel discussion on "Organizing to Combat Transnational Threats," during the annual conference of the ABA's Standing Committee on Law and National Security, Nov. 12-13, 1998, were summarized at length in National Security Law Report, June 1999.
