## FACULTY ACTIVITIES

**Alex Albright** was invited to talk to the Travis County district judges about the new discovery rules on Feb. 8, 1999.

**John Dzienkowski** testified before the ABA's Commission on Multidisciplinary Practice of Law in Los Angeles on Feb. 5, 1999. He examined three ways in which the ABA could accommodate multidisciplinary practice-lawyers working on teams with non-law professionals such as accountants, engineers, psychologists, etc., to deliver law and non-law services-while protecting the core values of the legal profession.

**William Forbath** delivered a lecture to the UT LAMP program on Jan. 12, 1999, entitled "Impeachments Past and Present: Perspectives on the Clinton Trial." On Jan. 25, 1999, he presented a paper to the

University of Pennsylvania School of Law Faculty Workshop on "The Death of the Social." **Forbath** delivered an endowed public lecture at Rice University, Feb. 12, 1999, on "Undesirable Aliens/Unfree Labor: National Identity and State Power in Immigration Law and Policy, 1882-1924," and will give the same lecture as the annual Verne Moore History Lecture on Feb. 26, 1999, at the University of Rochester. **Forbath** will present a paper on "Race and Class in 19th Century Immigration Law and Politics" at the NYU Legal History Workshop on Feb. 23, 1999.

**Francesco Francioni** completed his 1997-98 term as President of UNESCO's World Heritage Committee with the opening address to the 155 member nation representatives at the Committee's meeting in Kyoto, Nov. 30, 1998. In the fall of 1998 **Francioni** chaired an ad hoc panel investigating the dispute over the Jabiluka uranium mine in Australia, which involved the aboriginal peoples of the Northern Territory and the Australian government, and prepared the written report which was adopted at the Kyoto meeting. During 1999, **Francioni** will coordinate a research project on trade liberalization and domestic public policies, funded by the European Union, and will give a series of lectures on the topic in the fall of 1999 at the Institute of Advanced International Studies at the University of Paris-Sorbonne. **Francioni** lectured on "Customary International Law and the European Convention on Human Rights" at Gray's Inn in London, Feb. 18, 1999. < /P>

**Lino Graglia** will be one of the invited speakers at the Federalist Society's 18th Annual Symposium on Law and Public Policy, Apr. 9-10, 1999, at the University of Chicago Law School, where he will give a talk entitled "Is Antitrust Obsolete?".
