During the Law School's Reunion Weekend, Apr. 14-15, 2000, **David Anderson** gave a presentation on "Privacy and the Media"; **Lynn Baker** discussed her forthcoming book, *States Rights and the Promise of Liberty: Towards a Federalism for the 21st Century*; **John Dzienkowski** led a roundtable discussion on legal ethics; and **Stanley Johanson**, **Douglas Laycock**, **Shelli Soto**, and **Gerald Torres** were among the panelists for a discussion of the Hopwood litigation.

Lynn Blais and **Tom Russell** were elected as the Law School's representatives to the UT Faculty Council for 2000-2002.

At the Texas International Law Journal's symposium, "Energy and International Law: Development, Litigation, and Regulation, Apr. 17-18, 2000, at the Bass Lecture Hall, **Francesco Francioni** was a panelist for a session on "Energy & Environmental Litigation"; and **John Dzienkowski**, **Patricia Hansen**, **Ernest Smith**, **Gerald Torres**, and **Russell Weintraub** served as panel moderators.

David Anderson was quoted in the Austin American-Statesman, Apr. 7, 2000, about a Travis County judge's order prohibiting the Associated Press from publishing information contained in state-issued documents.
