

INTERGOVERNMENTAL COMMITTEE ON REFUGEES

When the Executive Committee of the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees met on August 4, the recommendations of the Bermuda Conference were considered. These included the reorganisation of the Intergovernmental Committee, and the recommendations of the Executive Committee have now been communicated by the Director, Sir Herbert Emerson, to all the Member Governments of the Committee, twenty-nine in number.

When these Governments have been able to form their views on the proposals, further information will be given regarding their scope.

Mr. Patrick Malin has been appointed Vice Director of the Committee.

From 1940 to 1942 Mr. Malin was American Director of the International Migration Service, and has first hand experience of refugee work in Switzerland, France, Portugal, Spain and England.

Previous to his appointment as Vice Director, he was a member of the Department of State at Washington, his duties being concerned with foreign relief and rehabilitation operations.

It is expected that he will be able to take up his new duties at an early date.
