NORTH AFRICA AIR COMMUNIQUE

Allied Force Headquarters,  
August 29, 1943.

The North West African Air Forces yesterday continued their heavy attacks on railway communications in Italy.

The railway yards at Cancellò and Aversa were attacked by medium bombers and the railway yards at Terni by heavy bombers.

Light bombers raided railway communications at Lanczia. Other railway targets in Southern Italy were attacked by fighter-bombers.

Wireless installations on Ventotene Island, off the West coast of Italy, were hit by medium bombers.

Fighter-bombers in the course of a swoop over Sardinia made attacks on industrial buildings. On the night of August 27/28 light bombers carried out attacks on gun positions at San Giovanni.

In the course of these operations 28 enemy aircraft were shot down. Eight of ours are missing.

Further reports show that <sup>in</sup> the combats over Foggia on August 25 twenty-one enemy aircraft were shot down in addition to those already reported. Over Capua on August 26, an additional four enemy aircraft were destroyed.

Light bombers last night attacked the railway yard at Taranto.
