Artist Statement

My work is influenced by my bicultural background. It is a combination of images that relate to both my Mexican and American heritage. Together they have shaped my life and have created an existence of dual social and cultural contrasts. The reversal of the thinking process and the expression of that process has been a prominent factor in my world that started in Spanish and was reshaped in English. Working the fields and the earth as a young boy and now working with computers and the World Wide Web. This constant change and development has shown in my work. Early on in my career as an Artist I developed my skills as a painter and now have ventured into the world of Printmaking. Not only working with some of the same tools and methods as before, but also working with new ones that our new High Tech society sometimes commands. It's a new and interesting world that is limited only by the limits placed on it by me. This new experience takes me far away from my beginnings to the present that is full of technical possibilities. Possibilities that can take me back and forth with a click of a mouse. Where color can change in an instant and images can span the length of time in a second. This is a new era. An era of bytes and bits. Of silicone and megahertz. An era that has changed me and my art for now.
