EIGHTH AIR FORCE LIBERATORS AGAIN ATTACK PAS DE CALAIS TARGETS

Continuing the daylight assault of the U. S. Eighth Air Force against targets in Nazi Europe, B-24 Liberators Thursday attacked military objectives in the Pas de Calais area of France for a second successive day.

The bombers were accompanied by Eighth Air Force P-47 Thunderbolts, and neither bombers nor fighters encountered aerial opposition. Meagre flak was experienced. No U. S. aircraft are missing from the operation.

S/Sgt. Herman B. Johns, of 103 Fernwood St., Barberton, O., nose gunner on the Liberator "Carol-N-Chick," reported: "This was the easiest of my 17 missions. We flew to the target, bombed and returned on schedule without serious opposition."

Second Lt. Richard L. Henderson, of 303 High St., Longview, Tex., pilot of the Lib "Wolfpack", said: "With only moderate flak and excellent fighter support doing the blocking for us, we tackled our target without trouble and scored a touchdown with our bombs."
