1. Brief project description:

To assist the student-run recycling program through the purchase of blue barrels (for recycling containers) and plastic bags. Additionally, we wish to assist in the purchase of anti-FTAA posters for the upcoming mobilization to Miami in November.

\$ 200 - Recycling: a) barrels b) bags

\$ 100 - anti-FTAA posters

\$ 1,000 copies to advertise for forums, projects, mobilizations

- \$ 7 a barrel @ "Dave the Barrel Guy" in San Antonio. Every 3 barrels yield two recycling containers. We may need to rent a \$30/day U-haul to transport them. 20 plastic bags @ \$4.50 @ Breed & Co.
- Posters are \$100 for 100, purchased from the Beehive Collective in Portland, Maine. They traditionally serve as non-profit middlepersons through a copy shop there, and that copy shop's name can be provided if necessary.

\$ 40 toward barrels, bags & gloves (5 pair just recently bought) from pulling textbooks out of the recycling bin during student-run recycling & selling them back to Half Price Books.
