#### In Support of Relationship Violence Prevention Month

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**WHEREAS**, Student Government serves as the official voice of students at the University of Texas at Austin; and

WHEREAS, Over 4 in 10 college students have experienced relationship violence; and<sup>1</sup>

WHEREAS, The University of Texas at Austin has resources to help students who are survivors of relationship and/or sexual violence get the support they need; and

WHEREAS, Relationship violence is an issue that will affect over 20% of women in their lifetime and 7% of men in their lifetime; and <sup>2</sup>

WHEREAS, Relationship violence is often an invisible issue, and learning to see the red flags could help someone in need; and

**WHEREAS**, Voices Against Violence (VAV), a program of the Counseling and Mental Health Center, organizes Relationship Violence Prevention Month on campus; and

WHEREAS, The purpose of Relationship Violence Prevention Month is to spread knowledge in order to empower those in need; and

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WHEREAS, Relationship Violence Prevention Month marks the start of VAV's second annual "Be an Anchor" fundraising campaign, where student organizations commit to support the VAV Survivor's Emergency Fund; and

WHEREAS, Relationship Violence Prevention Month will feature many events such as the Texas Muslim Student's Association's Fundraising Dinner in cosponsorship with Voices Against Violence to support the VAV Survivor's Emergency Fund, the Rally for Healthy Relationships for the purpose of engaging the university community in an informative discussion about healthy relationships, the Get Sexy. Get Consent. performances to illustrate to the UT community on how we negotiate consent, and Breaking the Silence to provide a safe space for survivors and allies to share about experiences of relationship violence; and

WHEREAS, the Rally for Healthy Relationships seeks to create a culture of prevention of relationship violence by encouraging students to commit to the 7 C's of healthy relationships: consent, communication, care, consideration, compassion, conflict resolution, and collaboration; and

WHEREAS, Breaking the Silence, an event co-sponsored by Services for Students with Disabilities, will also highlight how individuals with disabilities are disproportionately affected by relationship violence<sup>3</sup>; and

WHEREAS, Through Relationship Violence Prevention Month, Voices Against Violence hopes to shed light on: what relationship violence is, what we can do to help those experiencing relationship violence, what resources are available on campus to survivors of relationship violence, and how relationship violence can be prevented; and
