I am in the throes of page proof and there is one item that you might put me right on, namely:-

Are the words underlined in red correctly spelled ?
I have a doubt and have no means of checking. Believe I got
the reference from Baker as I do not have the paper myself.

I had some unpleasant criticism from one quarter, but
L. B. Kellum is going over the page proof of my book for
review purposes and his opinion makes me feel better. He had
forgotten about Burckhardt when he wrote me as he stated that
the book is the most valuable ^{extant} that has appeared on the geology
of Mexico. He also says it is the best of the A. A. P. G.
special volume series, and that they can not afford to bring
out another superficial volume after this one. These remarks
are confidential to yourself (H. J. P. only exception).

Perhaps you know Kellum ? If not, Adkins told me this
six weeks ago in Houston: "There are only three men in U. S. A.
who know anything about the Cretaceous and Kellum is one of
them." Adkins is too modest and sincerely did not include
himself among the three. (*There must be four*).
