U.S.-CHINA (TOPS 37)

WARSAW, POLAND (AP)-BREAKING AN 11-YEAR POLICY OF PUBLIC SILENCE, RED CHINESE AMBASSADOR WANG KUO-CHUAN CAME OUT OF A CONFERENCE WITH U.S. AMBASSADOR JOHN A. GROMOUSKI TODAY WITH A CHARGE THAT THE UNITED STATES AND RUSSIA "ARE SIGNING A DUET" IN AN ATTEMPT TO CREATE THE IMPRESSION OF A U.S.-RED CHINESE RECONCILIATION.

THE MEETING WAS ONE IN A SERIES THE U.S. AND CHINESE AMBASSADORS HAVE BEEN HOLDING SINCE THE FIRST ONE IN GENEVA MORE THAN A DECADE AGO. THE POLICY HAS BEEN THAT NEITHER SIDE WOULD SPEAK PUBLICLY BEFORE OR AFTER THE CONFERENCES.

WANG EMERGED FROM A THREE-HOUR MEETING TO CHARGE THAT THE UNITED STATES "HAS TIME AND AGAIN VIOLATED THE AGREEMENT TO MAINTAIN SECRECY."

"THE SOVIET REVISIONIST LEADING CLIQUE HAS FOLLOWED UP BY CONDUCTING A GREAT DEAL OF PROPAGANDA ABOUT A CHINESE-U.S. DIALOGUE," WANG CONTINUED.

"SIGNING A DUET THEY HAVE SPREAD DECEPTIVE PROPAGANDA IN A VAIN ATTEMPT TO CREATE AN IMPRESSION OF CHINESE-U.S. RECONCILIATION, COVER UP THE UNITED STATES IMPERIALIST POLICIES OF AGGRESSION AND WAR AND OBSCURE THE BANNER OF OPPOSITION TO U.S. IMPERIALISM HELD ALOFT BY THE CHINESE PEOPLE."

THE CHINESE ENVOY THEN HANDED NEWSMEN THE 11-PAGE TEXT OF HIS MAIN STATEMENT TO GROMOUSKI AT THE MEETING.
