**Brief project description:**

The Student Endowed Centennial Lectureship (S.E.C.L.) was established in 1983 by several student organizations who wanted to create a program to bring outstanding lecturers to campus. The SECL was intended to be a gift from the students in commemoration of the centennial birthday of the University. Over the course of several years, students raised a significant amount of money to create an endowment to ensure that the University community would enjoy excellent speakers every scholastic year.

In the past, the SECL endowment has brought nationally recognized personalities such as the noted author Larry McMurtry, Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor, and the Oscar award winning actor Tommy Lee Jones. The goals of the endowment are to secure speakers who can enrich the University community and who are leaders in their respectful fields. The program focuses on maximizing the interaction between the Centennial Fellow and the students of the University. Typically, the Centennial Fellow speaks briefly before a classroom of students, has dinner with a small group of students and administrators, and talks at length before a larger group of members of the University community. The lecture is open to all members of the University community and the SECL does not charge students, faculty, or staff for the event.
