Your box of fossils arrived on time and proved highly satisfactory. Every species is new and they will be a desirable addition to my collection which contains in addition to many Oregon species 67 species from France. I considered myself very lucky to obtain these in exchange for Oregon material.

I hope to have much more desirable material to exchange next winter, and if so I shall let you know as I would like another box or two of fossils from your region.

This completes my exchanging for this season and every exchange has been satisfactory. Several have asked for more material next winter and I shall send them such as I have that is new to them. I am having Prof. Hubert Schenck of Stanford University and Prof. Chas. Weaver of Washington State University help me in identifying my material and I shall send them samples of everything new that I find.

I wish my labels to be as exact as possible, though mistakes sometimes occur, owing to the imperfection of the fossils and insufficient study of the Oregon Tertiary by geologists. Many changes are being made both as to species and strata, but I shall try to follow the best authorities.
