**AR 12 Requesting the Improvement of Safety and Appearance on the
Scarborough Property of The University of Texas at Austin**

WHEREAS: The University of Texas has purchased property owned by the Scarborough family on 27th street between Guadalupe St. and Whitis Ave.

WHEREAS: A University residence hall is planned to be constructed on this location by 2005.

WHEREAS: There are three large light posts from Guadalupe St. to Whitis Ave. on 27th street.

WHEREAS: One light on 27th street between Guadalupe and Whitis moving east is currently not operable.

WHEREAS: On Whitis there is only one lamp post along the perimeter of the Scarborough property.

WHEREAS: Tree branches on Whitis Ave. are severely obstructing the lighting in this area.

WHEREAS: The surface textures, the width and the accessible routes of the sidewalk are not compliant with the State of Texas Elimination of Architectural Barriers Program Article 7, Article 601 B Texas Revised Civil Statutes.

WHEREAS: It is the responsibility of The University of Texas at Austin to provide a safe environment for its students on University property.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Student Government of the University of Texas at Austin requests Physical Plant to fix and increase lighting in the specified area around the Scarborough property.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Student Government of The University of Texas at Austin requests Physical Plant to trim the tree branches that are obstructing visibility on the area around the Scarborough property.

BE IT RESOLVED: That the Student Government of The University of Texas at Austin requests Physical Plant to bring the sidewalk into compliance with the State of Texas Elimination of Architectural Barriers Program.

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED: That the Student Government of The University of Texas at Austin also requests that the University of Texas Police Department install an Emergency (Blue Light) Call box on the corner of 27th street and Whitis on Guadalupe.
