Thank you for your letter of December 16th, and for the reprint of your paper which arrived safely. I regret that the copy that you received of my paper "Primary Sex-Phases in Ostrea edulis" was defective. I am sending you today, under separate cover, a complete copy.

The evidence against the use of Gryphaea angulata iak. as the genotype appears to be irrefutable. I presume that Gryphaea as now defined by you is not sufficiently wide. . . to include living forms. If so, it appears that we shall have to re-name the Portuguese oyster and, of course, the Eastern Atlantic oyster from the U.S.A., which I believe to be of the same genus. Your further observations would be appreciated.
