Dear Miss Tucker:

Your letter of October 13<sup>rd</sup> has put before me a problem I can not solve.

I have no specimen from the type locality of Peoten clarkeanus, Sowipa Creek, in Alabama. Therefore, I am unable to compare it with the species in question. I presume that Dr. Collins has the type lot of both Peoten clarkeanus and Peoten burlesonius. Therefore, his opinion concerning both species would be decisive.

I said in Washington that one should compare Peoten burlesonius with all other Peoten species described from the same horizon--that is, the Weches and Cane River--in order to avoid duplication. It is very well possible that the Lisbon of Sowipa Creek corresponds to the Weches in age. As you know, the Lisbon in Alabama contains a whole series of separate formations that should correlate with the Cane River, Sparta, and the Crockett of Texas. Just how they correlate is at best entirely unknown and just where the Sowipa Creek locality falls in the section is not known. In the absence of the fossils, it is possible that it represents a Weches horizon. At best, the problem of the exact correlation of the Lisbon formation is the most urgent problem that I know.

I hope this information will help you to finish your chapter on Peoten burlesonius (or is it burlesonis?)
