Dear Sir:

Each of the three stack levels now equipped in the Old Library Building contains shelving as follows:

Narrow base

8 units of double faced shelving, 18 feet long, (6 sections)  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet high,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide.

1 unit of double faced shelving, 15 feet long (5 sections),  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet high,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide.

Wide base

6 units of double faced shelving, 18 feet long (6 sections),  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet high, 30 inches wide.

2 units of double faced shelving, 15 feet long (5 sections),  $7\frac{1}{2}$  feet high, 30 inches wide.

This shelving could remain installed providing the structure would be ample support for a more flexible arrangement on levels 4 through 7 to provide carrel areas for readers, narrower shelving for newspapers, and areas for special filing equipment.

If this is not practical several units of the shelving could be utilized as follows:

East Basement Area of Old Library Building

12 to 26 of the 18 ft. lengths depending upon the amount of space to be used by ventilating equipment.

Archives work room - Basement level

2 of the 15 ft. lengths  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide

Loan Desk Area - Main Floor, Old Library Building

2 of the 9 ft. lengths,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide with enough shelves for 10 to a section.

For Textbook and Curriculum Library if area for expansion made available.

3 - 18 ft. lengths,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide.

For Document Collection of Main Library

6 - 18 ft. lengths,  $16\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide.

For equipping contemplated storage area in Law Building, sufficient quantity to fill the area made available.
