Dear Sir:

I think I have sent practically all the fossil crabs from the Cooks Mountain to Dr. Mary Rathbun of the U.S. National Museum, who is supposed to describe them eventually. I may still have a single small one which I got in the uppermost fossiliferous bed below (downstream) from the railroad bridge at Mossley's Ferry (Stone City). I will try to look up this collection.

There are a good many fossil crabs in the uppermost Escudido near the midway contact at the Blase Ranch locality (along Castano Creek) on the Mexican side of the Rio Grande. I think I left my collection in San Antonio but it might possibly be found. Kennedy first found that locality and Miss Rathbun told him the crabs were Recent! But that was many years ago.

You might arrange to borrow the specimens from Miss Rathbun unless she thinks she has prior rights.
