TO THE MEMBERS OF THE 1936 INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE MEET

One-Act Play.—Silver shield to winner, and small shield to runnerup—permanent trophies, and gold medals for three best actors and for three best actresses.

The Samuel French (New York) medal for best individual acting. Three-R Contest.—Silver shield to school winning first place, and gold, silver, and bronze medals for first, second, and third places, respectively. Shield is permanent award.

Typewriting.—Silver loving cup to school as permanent award, and gold, silver, and bronze medals to first, second, and third place winners, respectively.

Journalism.—Silver shield to school whose contestant wins first place; smaller shield to school whose contestant wins second. Gold, silver, and bronze medals to individuals winning first, second, and third places, respectively.

The silver cups, except those in rural pentathlon, and track, are to be in the custody of the winning schools for one year, and a cup must be won by the same school three years in succession in order to entitle that school to permanent possession of the same.
