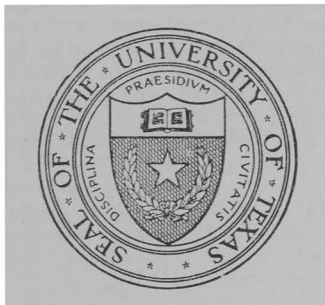

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE 1936
INTERSCHOLASTIC LEAGUE MEET

On January 16, 1858, seventy-eight years ago in the Legislature of Texas, Senator L. T. Wigfall almost predicted and endorsed these Interscholastic Meets when, arguing for the establishment of The University of Texas, he said, "Then let us bring our youth from the East and the West, from the North and the South, and ... teach them to feel that they are Texans. Girls' Debate.—Silver cup.

Tennis.—The Caswell & Smith silver cup for boys' doubles; University cup for girls' doubles; League cup, boys' singles; League cup, girls' singles.

Medals.—Gold, silver, and bronze medals for first, second, and third place winners, respectively, in each event of the track meet, and for declamation, extemporaneous speech, journalism, art, ready writers, and typewriting; also gold and silver medals to winners of first and second places, respectively, in tennis and debate.

Extemporaneous Speech, Boys' Division.—Silver loving cup.

Extemporaneous Speech, Girls' Division.—Silver loving cup.

One-Act Play.—Silver shield to winner, and small shield to runner-up—permanent trophies, and gold medals for three best actors and for three best actresses.

The Samuel French (New York) medal for best individual acting.

Three-R Contest.—Silver shield to school winning first place, and gold, silver, and bronze medals for first, second, and third places, respectively. Shield is permanent award.

Typewriting.—Silver loving cup to school as permanent award, and gold, silver, and bronze medals to first, second, and third place winners, respectively.

Journalism.—Silver shield to school whose contestant wins first place; smaller shield to school whose contestant wins second. Gold, silver, and bronze medals to individuals winning first, second, and third places, respectively.

The silver cups, except those in rural pentathlon, and track, are to be in the custody of the winning schools for one year, and a cup must be won by the same school three years in succession in order to entitle that school to permanent possession of the same.

Admission Charge to Play Tournament

DELEGATES' and contributors' tickets admit free to one-act play tournament. Others will be charged 25 cents to preliminaries and 50 cents to final.

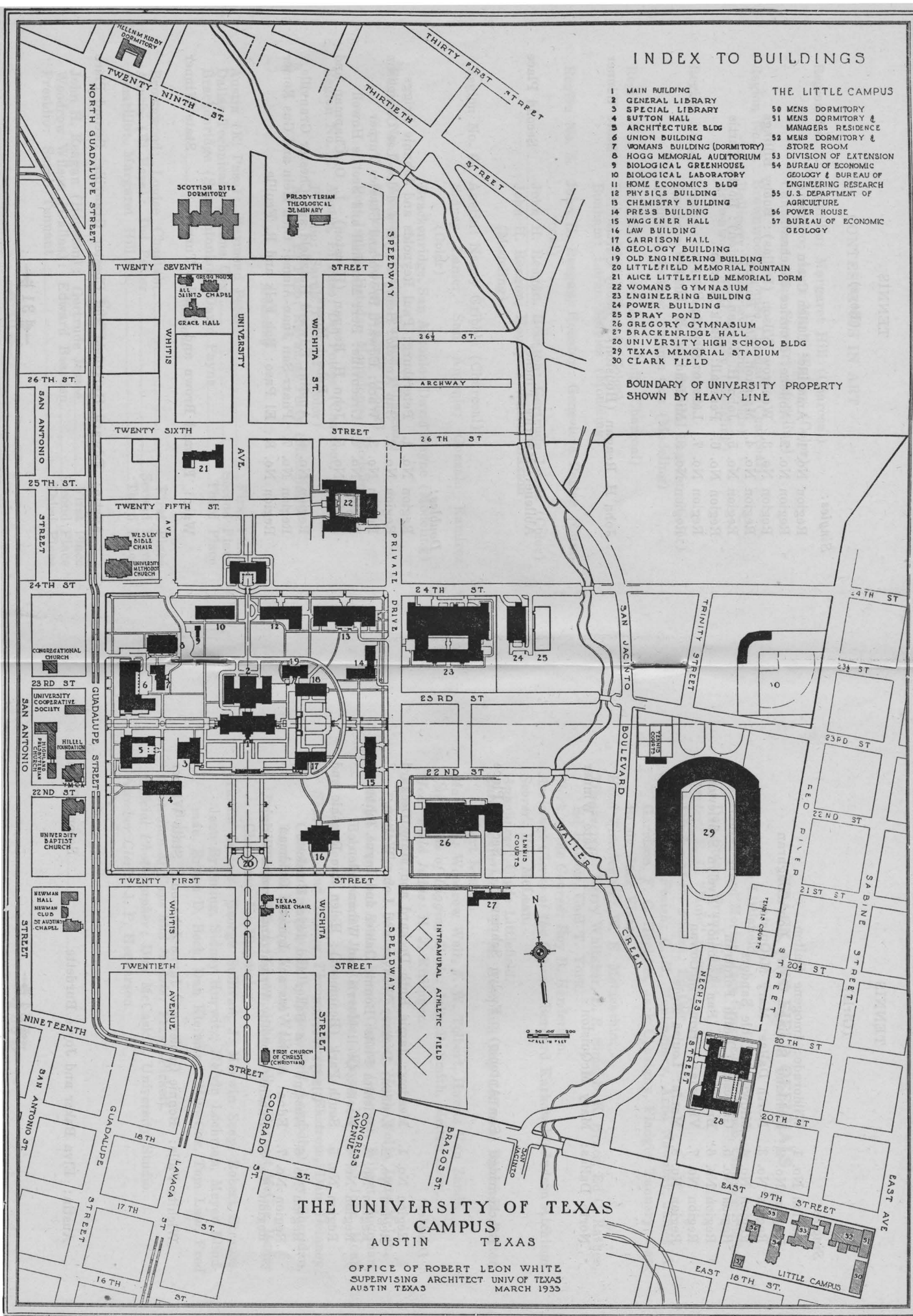
