Dear Dr. Stenzel,

It seems as though many more than three years have passed since most of thoughts were about Texas geology--- it's been four years since we sampled outcrops together, yet it's seems more like ten.

At the present all of my thoughts are concerning my return to civilian status, and graduate school, and the Weches. To date my return to civilian status is in the dim future, my return to graduate school is all planned but unfortunately that date depends on the Army also, but I've returned to the Weches all ready!!! I have a "mike" here with me, and all of my Smithville samples. At present I'm completing the fossil range of the Lovers at Smithville, and upon completion of that this month, I will be seeking your advice as to how the information should be presented to the "world" in regard to your type sections. Not knowing

exactly what should be presented to
the public as to illustrations, descriptions
of species, etc., I can not plan the
remained of my work on the Smithville
section. I am very anxious to have your
thoughts as to what should be published
on the "Foraminifera of the blocks at
Smithville, Texas," in regard to your
section since I've studied every inch of
your section as to its foram content.
As you probably remember, there are a few
new species described only in my thesis at
U.L., and these will have to be dealt with in some
manner. All suggestions will be greatly
appreciated.

There is a matter at hand that demands
my attention which results in a request that
I am making of you. I am applying for
a Fellowship at the Univ. of Wisconsin for
my post-war education, and this application
must be supplemented by a letter or two of
recommendation; therefore, I will appreciate
it very much if you will do me the honor

of writing such a letter in my behalf. The letter is to be sent by its writer to the Chairman, Geology Department, University of Wisconsin, Madison, Wisconsin. I have written to Mrs. Plummer in connection with this matter also—

I have recently obtained several U.S.G.S. quadrangles in the vicinity of Marcy, La. which should be very helpful after the war. I am very anxious to know the status of publication of your Houston County material. I must say, the memory of our trips into the field together are most pleasant, and I am more than anxious to again become one of your students.
