Your kind note of November 10, 1959 awaited my return last week from an absence of 15 months, during which time I had been studying in Europe on a Guggenheim Fellowship. Your enthusiastic reception upon seeing a page-proof copy of my textbook on invertebrate paleontology has been most gratifying, for you have certainly wrestled for a long time with the problems encountered in a project of this kind.

You may be interested to know that 4 or 5 people have commented favorably upon the use of uniform endings (in which I followed your lead) and only one person has so far objected to the practice. In the latter case it was argued that I should have followed whatever system was used by various authors of the Treatise of Paleontology.

I would appreciate very much having the advantage of your suggestions and criticisms as they come to mind. Thank you again for the courtesy of your writing.
