Dear Emmett:

Thank you for your offprint of your very interesting article and for your helpful letter which has just arrived. I am so glad you like our Map Folder which is in a very experimental stage. It is the first step toward a simple Guide with brief comments on each of the numbered objects on the Key in that order. As the Guide cannot possibly be ready this year I have done this to test the market. From the warm reception it is receiving both from archaeologists and from lay visitors it seems almost more useful than a guide.

We are feeling our way about distribution, as we do not have a publisher. In this way we can keep the cost down to a student level. Each copy costs about fifteen cents, and most of them are being sent out here. I shall be very pleased indeed if you wish to mention it in Nestor, as many of your readers are "Mycenaeans". Dr. Papadimitriou is being very kind and helpful and wants me to set aside 500 for the Service to be sold at the Gate. As our first printing was only 1000, and I have other orders here the residue at the moment with Mr. Hugo of the Meriden Gravure Company is less than two hundred.

If you do put a notice in Nestor you can refer enquiries to me here if you like. Would it be a great burden to you to have 30 to 50 copies to distribute in America? You could then refer European queries to me and those from the British Isles to Edith Clay as they have taken 30 copies for casual distribution. I have as yet had no reply from Heffer's of Cambridge, and they may have ordered direct from Meriden. If you do feel like helping me to this extent it would be best for you to order direct from Mr. Hugo asking him to enclose an invoice of cost plus carriage (which I will of course pay if you will send me the invoice). This method will enable you to set a price that will cover your part of the postage and labor.
