Dear Hesse :

The other papers on the Miocene near Burkeville cannot be published in the American Journal of Science. As you remember, we want to publish the general stratigraphic results with the A.A.P.G. Bulletin. However, if the fossil egg paper can be postponed and published in the American Journal of Science, maybe some of the data which appear to be duplications can be avoided and be merely mentioned by reference to the other papers. Although I am very much pleased and flattered with the idea of publishing all of our results in the American Journal of Science, I believe that the proper place for our chief paper is with the A.A.P.G. Bulletin. Therefore, I suggest that you write to Hull explaining that for the reason of obtaining the proper audience we need to publish our main stratigraphic results with the A.A.P.G. Bulletin. However, it is possible that you might want to publish the detailed description of the vertebrates with the American Journal of Science. In that case it would be all right to postpone the publication somewhat until your paper is ready.

It seems that the Bureau will publish a volume of paleontologic papers in the near future. I am figuring on placing the detailed descriptions of the invertebrates (Stenzel and Turner) in that Bureau publication.

Do you have any manuscripts on hand which you care to submit to the Bureau for publication within the next half year approximately?
