I am rather unhappy over the apparent impossibility of finding an order satisfactory, to all of us. At the moment I think I prefer Evans' to a frequency list, The distnace of C.W. Blegen in matters of this sort is somewhat annoying.

As for the classification I have made some observations on your setup, and think I can propose some slight modifications mostly in the allocation of capital leters, which when combined with similar and slightly more extensive changes in Pylos class. should produce a possible system for both. I don't expect that it will win immediate or complete acceptance but hope it will be a basis for negotiations, in quite a proper academic rivalry in the best sense.

I think sealings pots etc might reasonably be ldft outside the classivication since the kind of object outht be specified in any citations.

If with some such changes the classification would be established with sufficient room for Pylos and for Knossos to have separated small letter divisions, waxxxxxxxxxxx the groupings already made need not suffer much change a few first letters would change all together, a few seconds, principally Pylos (I imagine I can persade Mr. Blegen that our a, m, n-z distinction is not necessary). Let me know how this sounds, and send along counterproposals.
