INDIA JOINT WAR COMMUNIQUE NO. 114

The following communique from G.H.Q. India was received in London this morning:

Some Japanese attempts to infiltrate into one of our Arakan positions have been unsuccessful and our artillery have inflicted a number of casualties on the enemy. Otherwise there is nothing to report.

Yesterday April 24, R.A.F. Blenheims escorted by fighters bombed Meiktila airfield. A few energy fighters were seen but they kept their distance and no combats took place. Other bombers attacked Wuntho railway junction. All their bombs burst in the target area and hits were observed on the road, the tracks and on the largest railway shed.

Other attacks were made on objectives in the upper Chindwin and in the Mayu battle area, where some buildings were set on fire and Japanese troop positions were machine-gunned.

Last night bombs were dropped on Heho airfield and Yenangyaung. At the latter target a large fire was left burning.

From these operations all our aircraft returned safely.
