Before her death she gave her fossils and her professional books to the Bureau of Economic Geology, Univ. of Texas; since her death I have given her shell collection to the Museum at Texas Tech. College, Lubbock. They might be able to help you with oysters.

Texas Tech. also has the Southwestern Collection, Roy Sylvan Dunn. director, for Archives about people who have influenced the Southwest; they want records, letters, etc. about Mrs. Kemp and her husband, John F. Kemp. Would you like to write a letter about either or both of them, telling anything you wish- personal relations or professional; their

He was a student of the Kemps in Seymour High School. I have asked him to write about them, but have not heard that he has done so. Please phone and remind him.
