Funding Proposal for the AP10 16th Annual Student Conference March 1 and 2, 1996

The principal activity of the Institute of Latin American Studies Student Association (ILASSA) is our annual student conference held in the spring of the academic year. The conference, which is now in its sixteenth year at the University of Texas, is the oldest and largest student-run academic conference in the country. This international and cross-disciplinary event at the Student Union is open to all University of Texas students and local residents. It provides an excellent opportunity for our university community to observe and participate in discussions about issues of current importance and interest in the study of Latin America. Traditionally, the Students' Association has been very supportive of this event which ILASSA works energetically to realize each year.

In addition to the more than twenty different discussion panels which the conference comprises, ILASSA invites a keynote speaker - an acclaimed individual in the Latin American Studies field - to give the final address. Past speakers have included the distinguished Honduran poet Roberto Sosa, and the prominent forensic anthropologist Dr. Clyde Snow. This year we are actively engaged in recruiting Uruguayan author and journalist Eduardo Galeano as our keynote speaker. Best known as the author of *The Open Veins of Latin America*, Mr. Galeano offers an insightful look into the history, politics and culture of the Americas. Because Mr. Galeano is a highly sought-after speaker, ILASSA is excited by the prospect of his presence at our conference. We feel that a speaker of Mr. Galeano's stature will capture the attention of a broader range of UT students and increase conference attendance.

As indicated in the enclosed budget, ILASSA is seeking funding through a number of different channels. Our own efforts have netted over \$750.00 already this fall, and we will continue exploring our own avenues for funding so that we can meet our goal of over one thousand dollars in travel grants for conference participants. While the Institute of Latin American Studies acts as our primary source of funds, it has become increasingly necessary over the years to seek funding outside of the Institute. ILASSA is requesting the Students' Association to consider our funding request for \$1,000.00 to help cover the costs of bringing in a prominent and engaging guest speaker.

ILASSA strongly believes that our conference represents a valuable contribution to the study of Latin America at the University of Texas. Participants have the opportunity to gain valuable practical experience presenting their own research in front of fellow students. Students who attend are able to participate in seminars involving issues of current importance to the study of Latin America. Calls for papers are sent out each fall through electronic mail, and standard postal channels to over two hundred universities world-wide. To ensure high attendance and participation of all students and individuals interested in the numerous issues up for discussion, the event is actively publicized on campus and in the community.

We look forward to working with you on bringing a successful conference to the University of Texas community. Thank you for your consideration of our proposal.
