A.R. 37 Supporting the Fall Break Proposal Before the Faculty Council

WHEREAS, the student body at The University of Texas has expressed overwhelming support for a period of rest during the fall semester since this period of instruction lacks a substantial respite for students, faculty and staff.

WHEREAS, a break during the Thanksgiving week would not offer a timely respite for The University as it occurs at the end of the semester.

WHEREAS, after a thorough review of the feasibility and desirability of a fall break, the Fall Break Proposal garnered bipartisan support from the Calendar Committee of the Faculty Council.

WHEREAS, the 16-month interim period that will transpire until the enactment of a fall break will enable the associate deans of the College of Natural Sciences to address the issues revolving around the structure of labs.

BE IT RESOLVED, that The Student Government at The University of Texas urges the Faculty Council to approve the Fall Break proposal as set forth by the Calendar Committee.
