So far this summer. I have not been able to get work but I am still trying. There are several geophysical crews here now and I may be able to get on with one of them before the summer is wer but there is nothing definite as yet.

I wrote him about them last summer and this is the first opportunity he has had to come by to see them. I told him they were in the department at school so he will look at them when he goes back.
