When I go to Houston on the 18th, Carl Richardson's correlation committee will have a preliminary set-up for a stratigraphic column for the Houston district.

I should like to have one from your So. Texas Committee to take along. It might show diagrammatically or otherwise where the disagreements in usage have been, showing the several terms still in fairly good usage.

The suggestion has come from Houston that we consider a definite agendum for the correlation committees to begin with. Wayne Jones and Tom Bailey suggest starting with the Claiborne (Jones was the principal one suggesting this limitation, as he thinks the Claiborne nomenclature is quite complicated). The idea is advanced that we will do well to clear this up by November.

This may be the way to go about it, especially if most of the men are interested in the whole Tertiary. If we get too many going at once it might produce confusion. What do you think?
