I think your idea for the field conference is a most excellent one. Fall is probably the best time of year for such a trip.

I hope to spend next Saturday and Sunday going over Leon County and perhaps grabbing a few sacks of samples. <sup>1</sup> will, of course, be delighted to have you guide me but imagine <sup>1</sup> can recognize the broader features. <sup>1</sup>f all is well here, <sup>1</sup> shall perhaps leave Friday evening and spend the night wherever it can be spent -- <sup>1</sup> do not remember any place in Centerville so perhaps Buffalo will be it.

I will start in the northwest corner where you have mapped Sabine Town shale and, roads permitting, come down to below Jewett, down through Robbins and from thence whence I do not know. The Seguin, as described in the column, sounds like what we used to call Midway, so I would like to see that, though it looks like it might take some hunting.

Perhaps the thing I am most anxious to collect is your Mt. Tabor. I cannot help but wonder whether in the subsurface we have not placed your Spiller in the Yegua as we thought of it, that is assuming Ceratobulimina eximia is not in the Mt. Tabor shale. Unfortunately I believe it is some distance to the first available well samples to the scuth; I will look into it eventually. From your map it would appear that we will have to take Stone City a little more seriously than we have been inclined to do. It is interesting that it seems best developed acress the present nose.

I understand from Howe that he expects to get out a paper on St. Maurice forams this fall, so we will probably be able to supply you a fairly complete list by winter.
