In accordance with the express instructions of the His Excellency Dr. Hector Garcia Godoy, Provisional President of the Dominican Republic, I have the honor to request Your Excellency kindly to convey to His Excellency Lyndon B. Johnson the reply of the Chief of State of the Dominican Republic to the congratulatory message from the distinguished Chief of Government of the United States on the occasion of the exemplary general elections recently held in the Dominican Republic, which have restored representative democracy and institutionality in the country.

The text of the message is as follows:

"I have received your kind congratulatory message on the effort achieved to make the transition in my country from the turbulence of civil strife to the calm of free elections.
