AB 22 Amending the Election Code  
A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

Approved  
1-18-00

To modify the Election Code of the Student Government of the University of Texas:

Be it enacted by the Assembly of the Student Government of the University of Texas:

- 4.07 If a complaint is not dismissed, then a hearing must be held. The Election Board shall inform, in writing or via e-mail, the complaining party and all individuals or groups named in the complaint of the time and place of the hearing. The parties are not considered notified until they have received a copy of the complaint.
- 7.09 Polling places for all elections governed by this Code shall be limited exclusively to the University of Texas at Austin, ~~and must include~~ Polls must be located at no less than Fourteen (14) of the following locations must be used in an election:

- (a) Art Building;
- (b) Jester Center;
- (c) Jesse H. Jones Communication Center;
- (d) George Kozmetsky Center for Business Education;
- (e) Lyndon Baines Johnson School of Public Affairs;
- (f) Robert Lee Moore Hall;
- (g) Nursing School Building;
- (h) Pharmacy Building;
- (i) George Sánchez Building;
- (j) Townes Hall;
- (k) Undergraduate Library;
- (l) University Teaching Center; and
- (m) Welch Hall;
- (n) Ernest Cockrell, Jr. Hall. and
- (o) Gregory Gymnasium

~~7.16~~ On the first day of voting, polls shall be open from 9:00 10:00 a.m. until 4:30 4:00 p.m. On the first day of voting, one poll shall be open from 6:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. On the second day of voting, polls shall be open from 9:00 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. only. Persons standing in line when the polls close shall be allowed to vote.

7.12 Poll hours for any Runoff Election shall be from 9:00 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. only, on the date set by the Election Board for the Run-off Election.

7.15 The Election Supervisory Board must require that each voter provide a valid form of identification recognized by the University during voting as long as that information is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify how the voter voted in the election.

7.17 ~~Only the Telephone Enrollment Exchange (TEX) and absentee balloting shall be used to facilitate voting in all elections governed by this code. The Telephone Enrollment Exchange (TEX), Registrar's Online Services (ROSE), the Measurement and Evaluation Center (MEC), and absentee are acceptable for use in voting in all elections governed by this code.~~
