



The premise of "The Human Condition" public service radio series has been to offer listeners an opportunity to hear and thereby share perceptions of men and women who are knowledgeable in mental health. A criterion is that each guest has expertise in an area with direct bearing on the emotional strength and well-being of people — parents and children; minorities; the ill and the handicapped; career persons, professional and blue collar; the aged; the disturbed; the "have nots." Bert Kruger Smith serves as moderator for the weekly series. Cassette recordings of programs from a third season of broadcasting have been added to the Hogg Foundation Library collection. A new booklet, *The Human Condition - Third Series*, describes content of all three seasons and offers instructions for library check out.

### Announcing...

A radio interview with Robert G. L. Waite of the faculty of Williams College led to the leaflet *Mental Health and Leadership*. Dr. Waite, whose special area of interest is in modern Germany, found that the traditional tools of the historian are not sufficient to provide insightful understanding of the significance of Adolf Hitler as a leader within the climate of the times in which he lived and ruled. Additional study by this historian provided a psychological dimension and perspective, permitting a broader, wide-angle view of the dictator. ## National Advisors Meet at Lakeway

The Hogg Foundation's National Advisory Council met at Lakeway May 18-20. Participants were the members of the advisory body, three consultants from the faculty of the University of Texas, and Executive Committee members and program assistants of the Foundation staff. The group meets semi-annually for program-policy discussions.

#### Revision Available: Interpretation of the Mental Health Code

The pamphlet Interpretation of the Mental Health Code has been brought up-to-date in a fifth edition, now in press and available this spring or in early summer. The new edition covers Texas civil and criminal statutes and commitment procedures including changes or new acts through the 1973 State legislative session. The revision was prepared by Michael P. Rosenthal, professor of law, University of Texas Law School.

The NAC's newest appointee, Thomas F. A. Plaut, was attending his initial meeting. Alan Miller's participation marked the occasion of his second visit to Austin and the Foundation's review sessions. Drs. Miller and Plaut join Althea T. L. Simmons as members of the National Advisory Council. Ms. Simmons is national director for education, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Dr. Miller is director of the Whitney M. Young, Jr., Community Health Center and associate dean at New York's Albany Medical College, where he is also professor of preventive and community medicine. Dr. Plaut serves as counselor to the director, the National Institute of Mental Health.

Another first time participant in his new role as faculty consultant was Louis DeMoll, associate professor in the Graduate School of Social Work. This meeting was the last in the NAC term of Brewster Smith, vice chancellor of the University of California at Santa Cruz.

Other campus consultants at the sessions were Ira Iscoe, director of the University Counseling and Psychological Services Center, and Melvin Sikes, professor of educational psychology. Foundation staff participating were: Wayne H. Holtzman, Robert L. Sutherland, Bernice Milburn Moore, Bert Kruger Smith, O. Stanley Brown, Charles M. Bonjean, Adrian Fowler, and Reymundo Rodriguez. Physical arrangements for the meeting were coordinated by Dorothy Potter.
