## COMPLIANCE WITH TITLE VI, CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964 AND THE MODIFIED COURT ORDER, CIVIL ACTION 5281, FEDERAL DISTRICT COURT EASTERN DISTRICT OF TEXAS, TYLER DIVISION

*Reviews of local education agencies pertaining to compliance with Title VI Civil Rights Act of 1964 and with specific requirements of the Modified Court Order, Civil Action No. 5281, Federal District Court, Eastern District of Texas, Tyler Division are conducted periodically by staff representatives of the Texas Education Agency. These reviews cover at least the following policies and practices:*

- (1) acceptance policies on student transfers from other school districts;*
- (2) operation of school bus routes or runs on a non-segregated basis;*
- (3) non-discrimination in extracurricular activities and the use of school facilities;*
- (4) non-discriminatory practices in the hiring, assigning, promoting, paying, demoting, reassigning or dismissing of faculty and staff members who work with children;*
- (5) enrollment and assignment of students without discrimination on the ground of race, color, or national origin; and*
- (6) evidence of publisher procedures for hearing complaints and grievances.*

*In addition to conducting reviews, the Texas Education Agency staff representatives check complaints of discrimination made by a citizen or citizens residing in a school district where it is alleged discriminatory practices have or are occurring.*

*Where a violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act is found, the findings are reported to the Office for Civil Rights, Department of Health, Education and Welfare.*

*If there be a direct violation of the Court Order in Civil Action No. 5281 that cannot be cleared through negotiation, the sanctions required by the Court Order are applied.*

# Special Textbooks for Visually Handicapped Students

## GENERAL

Braille and Large-Type textbooks can be obtained through the Textbook Division by any district that has visually handicapped students whose visual acuity falls between 20/70 and total blindness. Annual registration of students is accomplished by completing a STATE CERTIFICATION OF VISUALLY HANDICAPPED STUDENTS form (obtained from the Special Education Division) for each student and returning it to that Division.

## BRAILLE BOOKS

Titles in this Catalogue with "B" in the right column were available when the Catalogue went to press. Other titles may become available as they are transcribed. It is suggested that all needed titles be requested and every effort will be made to fill the order.

## LARGE-TYPE BOOKS

Titles in this Catalogue with "L" in the right column are available.

First and Second Grade titles are not enlarged because the regular editions are in large type.

Orders for titles in this catalogue will be approved for only those titles selected for use in the district. Large-Type books will not be counted against quotas of the regular textbooks. It is advisable to supply the partially seeing student with regular textbooks for his use in studying illustrations, maps, charts, and diagrams which are not often reproduced satisfactorily in the large-type book.

## TAPED TEXTBOOKS

Many textbooks are available in taped form. The tape is loaned to the student for one school year. The tapes are four track 1 7/8 rpm on reels (not cassettes) and can be used on the APH-Modified Sony 105 Tape Recorder. A recorder can be borrowed from the Textbook Division. Some tapes are becoming available in cassette form. An appropriate Tape Player-Recorder is available for legally blind students.

## ORDERING PROCEDURE

It will expedite the handling of orders if these procedures are followed:

1. Please use REQUISITION FOR MATERIALS FOR VISUALLY HANDICAPPED, Form Tex-035. Please follow the instructions on the back of the form. In cases where braille textbooks are ordered for one-semester courses, please so indicate on the order beside each such title.
2. Titles should be grouped on the order according to the form in which they are needed; example: all Large-Type listed together, all Braille listed together, talking books together, taped books together, and tangible apparatus listed together.

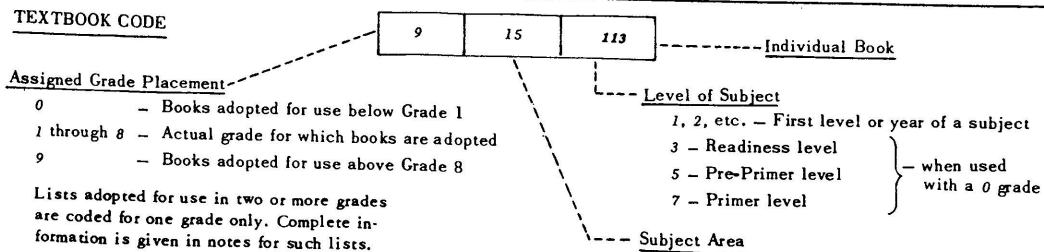
## DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS AND WORN-OUT LARGE-TYPE AND BRAILLE MATERIAL

As soon as any Braille or Large-Type books, Braille Writer, Tape Recorder, other tangible apparatus or supplies are no longer needed, such should be listed on Shipping List forms (available from the Textbook Division), packed and shipped by Free Mail. Receipts will be issued for all shipments. Please do not ship these expensive materials with other textbooks and never ship by freight.

# Textbook Quotas and Special Regulations

## Textbook Quotas

Normal Quota — Textbooks adopted for most subjects are supplied on the basis of  
 —110% of grade membership if the subject list is for any of Grades 1-6.  
 —110% of subject membership if the list is for any of Grades 7-12.

A pupil is entitled to only one book in a subject.

Irregular quotas\* — the following table shows the allowable quotas for those subjects to which the normal quota does not apply.

# Outline of Procedure for Adopting Textbooks

## To Be Used in the Public Schools of Texas

When texts are to be adopted under the provisions of the Textbook Law or when a contract is about to expire, the Chairman of the STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION gives public notice two months in advance of the meeting at which the adoption is to be made. This "Proclamation Advertising for Bids" lists the subjects and grade levels for which books will be considered, together with other directives the State Board desires to make in regard to bids that will be submitted. Following the publication of this proclamation, interested publishers may secure complete information from the Textbook Division about requirements for filing samples, forms to be completed, and dates upon which such items must be filed. Annual adoptions are made by the State Board of Education at its November meeting, but the Board may consider adoptions at other times.

Each year at its May meeting, the State Board of Education selects fifteen persons from the list recommended by the State Commissioner of Education to serve as members of the STATE TEXTBOOK COMMITTEE. These appointees serve for a term of one year. Each person shall be an experienced and active educator engaged in teaching in the public schools, and no two members may be from the same congressional district. A majority of the members are to be classroom teachers.

It is the duty of the State Textbook Committee to study the books offered for adoption and recommend to the COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION a complete list of textbooks which it approves for adoption at the various grade levels and in the various subjects for which bids have been called. Although the Commissioner may remove books from the recommended list (provided he does not reduce a list to a single adoption), he cannot add any book to the list.

The Commissioner submits the recommended list to the State Board of Education, which in turn may remove books, but not place any book on the list that has not been recommended by the Commissioner; neither may the Board reduce a list to a single adoption. The contracts awarded by the State Board of Education are made for varying periods, of one to six years, and books covered by such may be gradually introduced at the discretion of the Board.

Books to be used in LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEMS are selected from multiple lists, adopted by the Board, by a committee of teachers from each district, appointed each year to study the books adopted and to choose the texts best fitted to the system's needs. Common and rural high schools use selections made by the committee appointed by their county superintendent, but each independent school district has its own multiple-list committee. The report made to the Textbook Division by a school's committee is final; no changes or additions are permitted for the subjects included on a report. After a school is supplied with selected texts, these texts are to be used for the duration of the contract period; it is not permissible to return copies of a particular title in order to secure replacements of another title, even though that title may have been selected by the school committee.

Complete information regarding quotas, gradual introduction plans and regulations about the distribution of textbooks may be found in the latest Annual Textbook Report and Requisition Forms, in communications from the Textbook Division Office and this Bulletin.
