Do you know of any references on fossil gastroliths of crustaceans, such as are found at some seasons in the Recent Astacus? One of the problematica of Stone City Bluff (also present in the Weches at Smithville) apparently is a tiny gastrolith. (We are not 100 per cent sure, as the local crayfish do not have gastroliths during this part of the year -- and we have to find good specimens of illustrations to be sure of our identification.)
