

PROPOSED NEW ASIAN AMERICAN STUDIES (AAS) COURSES  
Courses to become effective in the academic year 2000-2001  
College of Liberal Arts

AAS 310.        Introductory Topics in Asian American Studies. An introduction to Asian American studies through a variety of disciplines. May be repeated for credit when the topics vary.

AAS 320.        Topics in Asian American Literature and Culture. May be repeated for credit when the topics vary. Prerequisite: Varies with the topic and is given in the Course Schedule.

AAS 325.        Topics in Asian American Economics, History, and Government. May be repeated for credit when the topics vary. Some topics partially fulfill legislative requirement for American history; these are identified in the Course Schedule. Prerequisite: Varies with the topic and is given in the Course Schedule.

AAS 330.        Topics in Asian American Anthropology, Geography, and Sociology. May be repeated for credit when the topics vary. Prerequisite: Varies with the topic and is given in the Course Schedule.

Topic 1: Contemporary Issues in the Sociology of Asian Americans. Some of the issues explored in this course include the socioeconomic adjustments and attainments of Asian Americans; their levels of assimilation and ethnicity; intermarriage and intergroup relations; settlement patterns and migration; marital and family characteristics. Same as Sociology 352M (Topic 11: Contemporary Issues in the Sociology of Asian Americans). Prerequisite: Upper-division standing.

AAS 379.        Conference Course in Asian American Studies. Supervised individual study of selected problems in Asian American studies. May be repeated for credit. Prerequisite: Upper-division standing and consent of the director of Asian American Studies.
