- IX. Introduction of Legislation by Representative Linda Duraj
 - a. A.R.3 In Support of Survivors of Sexual Violence
 - i. 3 minute recess to digest legislation
 - ii. 5 minute moderated caucus of this legislation
 - Lucas You can support sexual assault survivors without supporting this legislation
 - 2. Hasan Legislation can be served as a catalyst of social change
 - Bonin This legislation has good content, but its not necessary to be passed. It seems directly in response to current events. Introducing the legislation the day of seems unprecedented.
 - 4. Vanden-Hoek Legislation has been passed the same day.
 - 5. Pena SG needs to take constructive measures to prevent assault. The timing of this legislation makes SG appear to be taking a political stance. Need to make sure that we are not divisive.
 - 6. Dave Fantastic message that needs to be out. Has concerns about the context. Interested in solution-oriented legislation. Wants legislation that has substance and promotes certain change. This legislation does not support actual change
 - 7. Marshall SG is an inherently political institution. The last few words does mention the instigators of today's event.
 - 8. Deutsch Not necessary to send this legislation to YCT.
 - 9. Engel Spoke to the past Interpersonal Violence Preventing. Coalition Committee Co Chair. The chair said that 40-50 assault survivors have reached out to her about. Shows that there is a need for more resources and change. You can change legislation when it gets to committee.
 - 10. Lucas The last 4 fours are directed. We should send a message in some way, but maybe not this way. Sometimes solutions to this problem involve specific agents of this action
 - 11. Hasan In his opinion, any kind of legislation is actionable in its support of something. All resolutions are inherently toothless. If you have issues with the last 4 words, that can be changed in committee.
 - 12. Bonin YCT is in the back. They have received this message
 - 13. Obstfeld In his opinion, this legislation is ideal to come out today, but this should be a result of the terrible statistics represented on this sheet, not just the few opinions of a small group of people. The last four words of the legislation should be taken off.

- 16. Engel While this legislation might seem as just a pointed response to the events today, there has been similar efforts against sexual assault. It's not just about the process. The OU vs. UT weekend is one of the works weeks for sexual assault. The timing is great to take a stand on this issue
- 17. Pontikes If we do pass this piece, it would not get passed right away.
- 18. Rizvi This piece of paper is really pointless, as it doesn't do anything. I saw the protest too, and what happened, but I just chose not to engage in it. We should engage with this issue through other initiative such as "Hooked on our safety". You do not always have to engage with every person who does not agree with you.
- 19. Patel Agrees with Hubbul. This seems to be a symbolic piece of legislation, instead of action. The statistics are awful, but I don't see anything that this legislation is doing.
- 20. Bagepally The idea of just ignoring what is happening is not constructive. As the representatives of this student body, I believe it is ideal to issue some kind of statement about sexual assault.
- 21. Sereno In my personal opinion, this resolution is great, but it's also providing the platform for the issues that were raised. We are responding to how other groups want us to respond. I don't think we can make a plan in one week.
