Dear Turner:

The Weches in southwestern Leon County should be about thirty-five feet thick. I have very few detailed measured sections in the southwestern part of the county. Should that student succeed in measuring a section in detail or measuring one complete thickness, I would like to have his data as to thickness and exact location.

As far as I know there is no conglomeratic bed in the middle of the Sparta. It is possible that there are blays and greensands in the middle of the Sparta. However, I have not seen any indications of these and I believe it is improbable.

The name and address of the aerial survey here is the Southwestern Aerial Surveys, 108 East 10th Street, Austin.

Mrs. Katherine Van Winkle Falmer has just published Claiborne gastropods in two volumes and one separate volume for the turrellids. I have a complimentary copy of the two volumes. I suppose she will send you one copy too. The publication of these books changes our conditions very considerably. I hope you have occasion to come to Austin and talk things over with me some time.
